House of Iran suffered from loss of an outstanding member of its pioneer team, a former President and a great supporter of House of Iran. I will miss him and I will never forget all he did for House of Iran.

#### **Nowruz Piruz**

Nowruz, New Day, in Farsi language is a celebration of Persian New Year that goes back to 2,000 B.C., which is about 4,000 years ago.

When the first into Europeans settled in the plateau of Persia, the winters were harsh, long and cold. However, the beginning of spring, with the new leaves on the trees, fruit trees in blossoms and birth of baby birds in their nests promised them the end of harshness and beginning of new growth, thus, they celebrated the beginning of spring as their new year, with new hopes. Persians used to sprout 7 legumes or seeds before Nowruz because 7 was the lucky number. At Nowruz time, they saw which one has grown more, and that told them what to plant and harvest during that year.

Nowruz coincides with vernal equinox, which is the balance of day and night, when the day and night are both approximately 12 hours. Nowruz celebration is not limited to Iran, but approximately 13 other countries and people of Persian descents, all over the world regardless of their religious background or which continent they live in, celebrate Nowruz.

In Iran, families gather around a spread of Haft Sinn table. There are two items that are essential to Haft Sinn table, mirror and candle, both represent light and enlightenment in our lives. People decorate their spreads with spring flowers, coins, a holy or poetry book, painted eggs, gold fish in a bowl of water, and they put seven edible items, starting with letter "S", or Sinn in Farsi, that come from vegetables and nature in the spread. The seven items are symbolic and they represent renewal, affluence, medicine, health and beauty, sunrise, age and patience, all virtues of a bright and joyful year.


The United Nation's General Assembly in 2010 recognized the international Day of Nowruz, describing it a "spring festival of Persian origin". The United States House of Representatives passed the Nowruz Resolution in 2010 as well, "Recognizing the Culture and Historical significance of Nowruz".


